RECOGNITION OF MARY LOUISE DONER: Executive Director said he would like to take a moment to recognize Mary Louise Doner on behalf of all professionals that have worked on MEL program for the past 28 years. Executive Director said the 1987 June MEL meeting was the first

meeting attended by Mary Lou; she was recently hired by Vozza Administration Services later to be known as PERMA.

Executive Director said at that time, joint insurance funds formed 2.5 years prior and membership had grown to account for 20% of municipalities. Executive Director said one of the smartest things that Joe Vozza did was to bring Mary Lou on board because she brought her unique talent and skills to the organization.

Executive Director said as the former Director of Insurance and Risk Management for the County of Morris, Mary Lou brought significant claims handling experience and was a substantial contribution to the firm.

Executive Director said that he and James Kickham took over the firm in 1990 and identified four invaluable individuals that would take the organization forward: Emalee Cronwell, Cate Kieran, Joy Kirk and Mary Lou. With the exception of Joy Kirk and now Mary Lou, these individuals are presently still employed by Perma.

Executive Director said in addition to mentoring new hires over the years, third party administrators are far better organizations with Mary Lou's oversight. Executive Director said sentiments about Mary Lou can simply be made with this statement "We are what we are today in large part because of what Mary Lou has brought to the MEL."

Commissioner Landolfi said Dave Grubb and Jim Kickham may be the face of Perma, but Mary Lou is the brains of the operation. Commissioner Landolfi said Mary Lou was critical to claims management as she conducted the statistical analysis of claims, established criteria to evaluate third party administrators as well as holding them to those criteria; additionally Mary Lou drafted request for proposals for claims positions and evaluated several responses while also making it learning process for others. Commissioner Landolfi thanked Mary Lou Doner and presented her with a bouquet of flowers as a small gesture of appreciation.

Ms. Doner thanked the commissioners and professionals for their kind words and said it will be difficult to leave, but that it was time. Ms. Doner said her first order of business will be to "pay it forward" as many people - including strangers - were helpful to her during Superstorm Sandy. Ms. Doner said she has already taken the position as Chairman of the insurance committee within her housing community and added that she will not be retiring from life, but will be enjoying life.

WHEREAS, Mary Lou is a strong advocate for loss control measures and was instrumental in developing the FOCUS program and;

WHEREAS, Mary Lou is a dedicated consummate professional who is always courteous, responsive and respectful with a strong institutional knowledge of the joint insurance funds and;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund and the Municipal Excess Liability Residual Claims Fund that they honor MARY LOUISE DONER and pay tribute to her years of selfless service and expresses best wishes for continued success in all her future endeavors; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a duly authenticated copy of this resolution, signed by the Fund Chairperson, Fund Executive Director and attested by the Fund Secretary, be transmitted to MARY LOUISE DONER.

The resolution was moved by Commissioner Hirsch and seconded by Commissioner Shives with a unanimous voice vote.

AUDITOR YEAR-END REPORT:

Fund Auditor submitted and reviewed the Audit Report as of December 31, 2014 and reported that the Fund's statutory surplus stands at \$17,158,279. Auditor noted there were no comments – only a note on the impact of the economic conditions on the Fund's earned investment income and a suggestion to monitor the position of the Residual Claims Fund. Auditor said the Fund is in excellent financial condition and added that he was pleased with the cooperation of Fund Professionals. Fund Auditor also thanked Ms. Doner and said she made his job easier throughout the years.

Acting Chair thanked the Fund Auditor for his report. Acting Chair said it is gratifying to see an audit with no comments and credits that to the efforts of the Fund Treasurer and Perma staff; Acting Chair added that it is rare to see an organization of this size with a clean audit and also credited the management.

ACTUARY YEAR-END REPORT:

Fund Actuary submitted and reviewed the Valuation Report as of December 31, 2014 and said the total reserves at year-end were \$58 million comprised of \$40 million in IBNR and \$18 million in in case reserves. Fund Actuary said for the 1st time in the MEL's history the reserves have decreased from \$58 million to \$50 million primarily because the MEL transferred all open POLEPL claims to the Residual Claims Fund. Fund Actuary said the results continue to be strong for workers' compensation and liability is still problematic, however, the MEL is and continues to operate strongly.

ASSET MANAGER REPORT:

Jeffrey Lang and Karen DiMeglio from Wells Fargo provided a summary report on the Financial Assets and Performance of the MEL, which was included in the agenda for information. Mr. Lang reported the MEL has \$63.9 million in assets. Asset Manager said portfolio duration is below benchmarks since interest rates are expected to increase shortly. Interest income year to date is \$113,118 and \$732,950 since Wells Fargo became Asset Manager.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT:

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE: The Investment Committee met on May 7th; enclosed in the agenda were the minutes of the meeting for information. Commissioner Gildea said the MEL last sought proposals for Banking & Asset Management Services in 2011 and the committee recommends that the MEL issue a Request for Proposal (RFQ) for Banking and Investment Services.

MOTION TO AUTHORIZE THE RELEASE OF A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR BANKING & ASSET MANAGEMENT SERVICES:

COVERAGE COMMITTEE: The Committee had a video/conference call on May 18th; minutes were enclosed in the agenda for information. Deputy Underwriting Manager said the Committee reviewed and recommends approval of a language change to the Public Officials/Employment Practices Liability Policy – specifically the Exclusion 4 (J) as proposed by XL Insurance. Enclosed in the agenda was a copy of the revised language, with the changes tracked for reference.

Additionally, in 2014 the MEL asked its excess liability carrier to review JIF & MEL coverage documents. A sub-committee of the MEL Coverage Committee had its first meeting to review GenRe's comments and will continue to meet until it has completed reviewing all of GenRe's comments.

MOTION TO ACCEPT THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE COVERAGE COMMITTEE AND APPROVE THE LANGUAGE CHANGE TO THE PUBLIC OFFICIALS/EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES LIABILITY POLICY EXCLUSION 4 (J) AS PROPOSED BY XL INSURANCE:

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE: Executive Director said a meeting of the Management Committee to review 2016 MEL assessment allocations will be scheduled within the next coming months.

SAFETY AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE: The Safety and Education Committee met on March 27th and May 29th; enclosed in the agenda were the minutes of the March 27th meeting. Safety Director said at the May 29th meeting, the committee reviewed the usage hits to the recently released Camp Counselor online training and recommended additional purchase of 1,500 user credits at a cost of \$9,375. In addition, the committee discussed the

usage of the online training courses developed by the MEL and recommended additional purchase of 10,000 credits at a cost of \$12,500.

Safety Director said a training program geared towards Patient Lifting for First Responders will be used as a grant submission to Safety National. Additionally, Mr. McHale would be attending the MEL/RCF Claims Committees and report back to the Safety & Education Committee on any trending injuries or unique exposures.

Executive Director said the cost per unit of the MEL online training is less than the camp counselor training because the MEL owns the copyrights on all of its online training. Safety Director said in addition to the advantages of a copyright, the programs developed by the MEL are specific to members' exposure.

Executive Director said another emergent matter from the Safety & Education initiatives was the Fund's Management and Supervisor Training Consultant contract. Executive Director said the number of MEL Leadership Institute-Management Skills Training sessions to be held in 2015 was expanded from three (3) to six (6). Executive Director said the consultant indicated the additional services would be at a cost of \$9,000. Executive Director said it would be appropriate to amend the current contract to reflect the additional services.

MOTION TO ACCEPT THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE SAFETY AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE AND APPROVE THE ADDITIONAL COST OF SERVICES BY THE MANAGEMETN & SUPERVISOR TRAINING CONSULTANT FOR A COST OF \$9,000:

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE: The committee met on May 29th. Committee Chairman provided a verbal report and said 3 bills opposed by the MEL have been scheduled for hearings in the first week of June:

- A-1347 (Stender) / S-264 (Greenstein) which the MEL strongly opposes. This legislation establishes the "Thomas P. Canzanella Twenty First Century First Responders Protection Act"; concerns workers' compensation for public safety workers. Being heard by the Assembly Labor Committee on June 4th.
- S-781 (Weinberg) Makes various changes to law addressing meetings of public bodies to provide public with greater access to meetings and information about meetings. Being heard by the Senate Budget & Appropriations Committee on June 8th.
- S-782 (Weinberg) Makes certain access changes to open public records act; establishes State public finance website and creates program for development of local

websites; makes appropriation. Being heard by the Senate Budget & Appropriations Committee on June 8th.

Committee Chairman added that A-4444, the "Out-of-network Consumer Protection, Transparency, Cost Containment and Accountability Act.", was heard before the Assembly Financial Institutions Committee yesterday as discussion only so no vote was taken or changes adopted. Fund Lobbyist said this bill is being monitored to ensure the exemption for workers' compensation is not removed from the bill.

PERMA STAFF ANNOUNCEMENT: After 30 years of service to the MEL and its affiliated JIFs Mary Lou Doner, Vice President of Claims, is retiring on July 1, 2015. Executive Director said that Robyn Walcoff will join the operation as the Vice President of Claims. Ms. Walcoff said she is looking forward to working with everyone.

PUBLIC OFFICIALS/ELECTED ONLINE TRAINING SEMINARS: To supplement live presentations of this year's Elected Officials seminar, the MEL placed an on-line version on NJMEL.ORG. Executive Director said that to date, 400 officials have used this option.

RCF REPORT: The RCF met the morning of June 3, 2015 and adopted a resolution accepting local member transfers of Fund year 2011 liabilities. Enclosed in the agenda was Resolution 10-15 authorizing the transfer of the Municipal Excess Liability JIF's Fund year 2011 to the Residual Claims. In addition, enclosed in the agenda was a copy of Commissioner Cottman's report on the RCF Board's March meeting, for information.

MEL/MRHIF EDUCATIONAL SEMINAR: Executive Director said 175 people attended the MEL/MRHIF Educational Seminar on April 17th. Executive Director said it would be appropriate to schedule the 2016 seminar in advance to avoid scheduling conflicts and said the fund office was able to reserve the same venue for Friday May 13, 2016.

ON-LINE EPL TRAINING: The fund has a contract with VCS to produce on-line training courses not to exceed \$7,907.50 per course. Executive Director said VCS's cost to produce the most recent Employment Practices Liability Training exceeded this amount by \$1,732 due to significant rewriting of the content, additional formatting effort to accommodate & synchronize the slide titles to the narrative, the purchase of 4 stock images and the purchase of 2 external drives to store the program's project files. Executive Director said it would be appropriate to authorize payment of the additional expense.

MOTION TO AUTHORIZE THE ADDITIONAL PAYMENT OF \$1,732 TO VCS:

OPRA: Executive Director distributed a memorandum which included a proposed addendum to the Fund Attorney Contract recommending a change to the handling of OPRA requests for MEL and MEL member JIFs in light of Mary Lou Doner retiring on July 1, 2015 and due to the evolving complexity of OPRA, the function should involve legal counsel going forward. Commissioner Shives requested that this matter be discussed in Executive Session; the discussion and motion on the table was held.

LEAGUE MAGAZINE: Enclosed in the agenda was the 2nd and 3rd of a series of MEL advertisements to appear in the League magazine. Each advertisement in the "Power of Collaboration" series will be different and will highlight activities of the MEL and JIFs as well as people who have rendered significant service.

CLAIMS COMMITTEE: The Claims Review Committee is scheduled to met immediately following the Board meeting. Minutes of the March and May meetings were distributed for information.

Lastly, Fund Attorney said the Super Storm Sandy open claims are moving through the "claims management conference" and "mediation" process and is expected to conclude by July 1, 2015.

MANAGED CARE:

REPORT: A report was included in the agenda showing the Savings and Penetration report as of April 2015; the total billed was 1,722,575.25 million with approved bills of \$853,908.68 for a total savings of 50%.

Managed Care Provider distributed a Savings and Penetration Report as of May 2015; the total billed was \$2,687,704.53 with approved bills of \$1,247,430.76 for a total savings of 52%.

A 2nd report was distributed which detailed the charges by specialty; Managed Care Provider said the Facility and Ortho/Neuro charges were the two highest. In addition, a 2nd report detailed seven claimant changes vs. payments and the resulting savings.
