Directs school districts to establish policies and require training for employees on issues regarding child sexual abuse.

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1 AN ACT concerning child sexual abuse awareness and 2 supplementing chapter 36 of Title 18A of the New Jersey 3 Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. A school district shall establish a policy designed to increase 9 staff, student, and parent awareness of sexual abuse of children. The 10 policy shall address issues including knowledge of warning signs that 11 a child may be a sexual abuse victim, prevention techniques, actions 12 that a child victim should take to obtain assistance, and available counseling options for students affected by sexual abuse. 13 14 b. A school district's policy under subsection a. of this section 15 shall require that teachers and other school employees complete 16 training which includes, at a minimum, information regarding the 17 following: 18 (1) factors indicating that a child is at risk for sexual abuse; 19 (2) recognition of warning signs indicating that a child may be a 20 victim of sexual abuse; 21 (3) internal procedures for seeking assistance for a child who is a 22 victim of sexual abuse or is at risk for sexual abuse, including referral 23 to a school counselor, social worker, or another mental health 24 professional; and 25 (4) techniques for reducing a child's risk of sexual abuse. 26 c. A teaching staff member may satisfy in each annual 27 professional development period one or more hours of the professional development requirement established by the State Board of Education 28 29 through participation in training programs on child sexual abuse 30 awareness and prevention. 31 32 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply to 33 the first full school year following the date of enactment. 34 35 **STATEMENT** 36 37 This bill requires school districts to establish policies designed to 38 39 increase staff, student, and parent awareness of child sexual abuse. 40 The policy will address issues including knowledge of warning 41 signs that a child may be a sexual abuse victim, prevention 42 techniques, actions that a child victim should take to obtain 43 assistance, and available counseling options for students affected by 44 sexual abuse. 45 Under the bill, a school district's policy must require that teachers and other school employees complete training that 46 includes, at a minimum, information on the following: (1) factors 47 48 indicating that a child is at risk for sexual abuse; (2) recognition of
